## Who / What / When / How

#### Who should apply?

- Students who want to spend a term or a year in Ireland, experience an Irish school and Irish life and who want to perfect their English
- Students who want to gain entry to an Irish or British university (a minimum of two years is usually recommended and may be compulsory)
- Students who wish to follow the full Irish Secondary School Programme from age 12 or 13

#### What do I need to apply?

- You must be aged between 13 and 18 years
- You must have a reasonable level of English
- · You must have achieved average or better than average grades in your last two school years
- · You must be in good health
- You must be positive about participating in the programme and be prepared to make the effort to adapt when you arrive

#### When should I apply?

We continue to accept applications as long as there are suitable vacancies – usually through the month of August. However you should remember that there are limited vacancies in all schools – and there are more Standard Schools than Elite Schools, and more Elite Schools than Boarding Schools. We strongly recommend that you are **guided** by these dates:

**Boarding Schools:** September Start: Apply by early April

Elite Schools: September Start: Apply by early May / January Start: Apply by early October

Standard Schools: September Start: Apply by early May / January Start: Apply by early October

Of course the earlier you apply the more choice you may have.

#### **Can I graduate from an Irish Secondary School?**

Yes – if you pass the Leaving Certificate in the final year. You will normally need to spend two years in an Irish school before taking this examination. If your grades in the Leaving Certificate are good enough you can then apply for entry to the university of your choice (including British universities).

#### Can I choose my school?

Of course while you may choose a school, the school will also ultimately choose you! Most schools have their own entry criteria and most schools have a limited capacity – so even if you are a brilliant student with fluent English, there may not be a suitable vacancy for you in your chosen school or school year. Here again HSI can assist you by recommending schools.

#### Can I choose my subjects?

When you have completed your application and provided us with all the information we need, we will match you to the best school that meets your needs - and this includes subject requirements. If you have specific subjects requirements, it is essential that we are aware of these when you make your application. Remember that not all schools offer the same subjects and this is where our local knowledge and expertise is really helpful.

## How to apply: Simple 5 Step Process

We make it as simple as possible. You complete one application form to participate in a HSI programme and we use this to apply to whatever number of schools you have a stated preference for and that we think will be interested in you. Your local HSI representative will give you all the material and information you need for a successful application.


## The Irish School System


The Irish secondary school system is divided into two cycles - Junior and Senior - each of three years duration. The Junior Cycle is a non-specialised programme covering a broad range of subjects. The Senior Cycle is more specialised to allow students prepare for university and career choices.


There are two State examinations in Secondary School – the Junior Certificate at the end of the first three years, and the Leaving Certificate at the end of the final three years (the Leaving Certificate is both an exit/graduating exam from school and an entrance exam for universities in Ireland and the UK).

The first year of Senior Cycle is called **Transition Year** and the objective of this year is to promote the personal, social, educational and vocational development of pupils and to prepare them for their role as autonomous, participative and responsible members of society. It combines Life-Skills programmes with a core academic curriculum. The final two years (5th & 6th Years) are preparation for the Leaving Certificate.

Students normally take a core program of English, Mathematics, Science, History/Geography, Modern European Language and up to 5 other subjects.

Students normally take 6 or 7 subjects (the minimum number of subjects required for university entrance is 6). All subjects are taught at two levels, some at three.

#### Note:

- No school offers the complete range of subjects the normal range offered is between 15 and 18 subjects.
- Students may also request examinations in up to 16 modern languages not listed in the official list of subjects above.

## **Academic Timetables & Calendars\*\***

The Academic year in Ireland runs from the end of August to the end of May\* and is divided into 3 Terms as follows:

## **Accommodation Options - Residential or Homestay**

Your living environment is crucial to your success in Ireland. Not all students are suitable for a residence, but most students are suitable for a host family.

HSI is very careful about selecting families to host our students. Apart from providing a clean and comfortable house, your host family provides a warm, caring family environment – they have an interest in your success – and they welcome you as an additional member of the family.

Furthermore for students who prefer to be part of a residential community, there are a variety of boarding accommodation available. Some schools are 7 Day boarding, and others are either 5 Day or 12 Day boarding. In 5 Day boarding schools students spend every weekend with a host family. In 12 Day boarding schools, students spend every second weekend with a family. 7 Day boarding schools may also close one weekend in every month. These closures are in addition to mid-term breaks in the first and second terms when students also live with host families.

## **Role of HSI Student Advisers**

#### **Supervision & Monitoring**

From the time the student arrives until they complete their programme, their assigned HSI adviser will be their primary point of contact. These advisers are experienced educational professionals and in co-operation with the school and local host family seek to ensure that each student maximizes their potential and overall experience.

#### **Guardianship & Emergency contact**

HSI provides AGPI & BSA accredited guardianship for all students for the duration of their study programme in Ireland. This involves ongoing student support including 24 hour emergency contact 365 days a year as well as attending parent teacher meetings etc.

#### Reporting

In addition to maintaining regular contact with the student, host family and school, the student adviser will personally visit the student at school once a month as well as a separate visit to the host family. Where necessary they will liaise between the school and host family on behalf of the student to help resolve any problems or difficulties that arise. At the end of each month they will prepare a personal monthly report for the natural parents detailing how the student is progressing academically (including language skills), socially and personally.

## **Description**

- · Boarding schools in Ireland often accept both day students and boarders
- These schools are privately owned but receive some maintenance from the Irish Government
- · Boarding schools vary from 5 Day (every weekend with a Host Family) to 12 Day (every second weekend with a family) to 7 Day (occasional weekends with a Host family)
- Host family accommodation provided during all official school closures except Christmas
- Excellent reputation & majority of graduates proceed to top level University courses

- · Resident pastoral and supervisory staff
- Comprehensive range of subjects
- Excellent facilities including sports facilities
- Excellent student/teacher ratio

## **Description**

- Elite State Boarding Schools in Ireland are not very widespread. There are only a very small number of these schools
- Until recently these were Private Boarding schools but are now maintained by the Irish
- These schools also accept day students

- Wide range of subjects and good facilities

- · Most students progress to university

## **Description**

- · Schools in Northern Ireland follow the British curriculum (GCSEs and A Levels)

- Excellent reputation with high progression rates to top universities
