The Nova Scotia International Student Program (NSISP) has been welcoming international students to the province's public schools since 1997. The NSISP offers fully immersive education in English or French at one of the province's 75 participating schools. Nova Scotia's public education system is one of the best globally and prepares students for continued success in post-secondary training.

Students from over 35 countries are accepted from grades 7-12 and can study for one semester, one year, or multiple years. The NSISP has intakes in September and February. NSISP students can choose from a wide variety of subjects within the Nova Scotia curriculum and credits are transferable to their home country. The NSISP believes in fully integrating students into the schools they attend and program policies limit the number of international students from one country to six per school. This ensures all NSISP participants have a truly Canadian academic experience.
