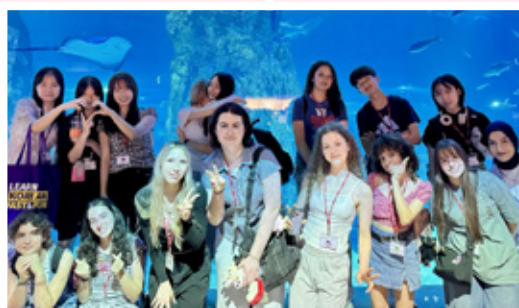

HOMESTAY



HELPING YOU CONNECT WITH THE GREAT KOREAN LIFESTYLE!

Living with a Korean host family is a key part of the Lexis Korea Junior Program. It offers a safe, welcoming home and the chance to experience Korean culture up close.

Our caring families are always ready to help, so don't hesitate to ask! All homestays provide single rooms with meals, and families are carefully selected to ensure students feel comfortable and supported.

HOMESTAY GUIDELINE

Please read the Homestay information carefully, as it will help you make the most of your stay with our great host families. Our host families are here to support and guide you—so don't hesitate to ask for help!

RELIGION

In Korea, people are free to practice any religion.

EQUALITY AT HOME

In Korea women and men are equal; you speak to a woman with the same respect as you would to a man. In Korea men and women do the same tasks, cleaning of the house, washing of dishes, clothes etc... are shared among the members of the family including a little help from yourself maybe!

RESPECT

Korean can be humorous, friendly, easy going people and believe in respect for each other, it is considered polite to say "Gamsahabnida(Thank you)" when asking for or receiving anything. Please remember to greet your Homestay hosts e.g., Annyeonghaseyo(Hello), Annyeonghi gaseyo(Goodbye), Annyeonghi jumuseyo(Good Night).

MEALS

You will receive two meals a day from your host family: breakfast and dinner.

LAUNDRY

Please discuss laundry arrangements with your host family when you arrive. If you're comfortable with your host doing your laundry, kindly ask where you should place your dirty clothes.

TOILETRIES

The host family will provide soap only in the bathrooms, all other toiletries for example, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo and deodorants must be provided by yourself.

BATHROOMS

Since Korea is a water-conscious country, please keep your showers to about 5 minutes a day.

TELEPHONE

If you wish to use the Homestay's telephone you must ask permission from your host family first. Make sure you do not spend too long on each call. If you wish to make international calls from the home telephone, it must be a collect call.

CURFEW

Students to be home by 6pm Sun to Thu and by 8pm on Fri and Sat.

DINNER

If you do not need dinner or you will be late for dinner, please inform your host family prior to the event.

BEING PART OF THE FAMILY

A Homestay can be an interesting and rewarding experience for you and the family. It offers you an opportunity to better understand Korean culture, whilst also offering a secure and safe environment to live in.

Try to fit into your host family and enjoy living as part of their family unit.





FIRST DAY

Your host family will kindly show you the way to school.
Please bring your passport with you only on your first day.

08:45	Welcome	When you arrive at the reception desk, the Lexis staff will warmly welcome you, check your ID, and guide you to the orientation room.
09:00	Orientation	The Director or Activity Co-ordinator will talk to you about: - The School - The Academic Program - Activities and excursions - Rules and Regulations - Local Area (Gangnam) You will be given a Welcome Pack. At Lexis Korea, you are encouraged to speak Korean only. This is very important and will help you quickly improve and become a confident Korean speaker.
09:30	Interview	Our Korean instructors will meet with you for a short interview to talk about your Korean level and to place you in the most suitable class. Please feel free to ask any questions you may have during the interview.
10:45-12:15	Korean Class	You will be allocated to your Korean class and start your first lesson.
12:15 - 13:15	Lunch Break	There are plenty of restaurants, food courts, bakeries and fast food around campus. It is about US\$5 - \$10. Students can enjoy a wide variety of cuisines, ranging from Asian to Western, near the Lexis Gangnam campus.
13:15 - 15:30	Activity & Excursion	You will enjoy a variety of K-Culture activities and excursions scheduled every day, immersing yourself in fun Korean culture and making new friends.



STUDENT GUIDE



Lexis Korea has rules to ensure that all junior students under 19 enjoy a safe, comfortable, and rewarding stay. Please follow these guidelines during your time in Korea.

KOREAN LAW

- ✓ NO consumption of alcohol
- ✓ NO smoking, including illegal substances
- ✓ NO entering licensed premises (bars or nightclubs)

ACCOMMODATION REGULATION

- ✓ Curfew times: Students must be home by 6:00 pm (Sun–Thu) and by 8:00 pm (Fri–Sat)
- ✓ Absences & lateness: Host families must always be informed if students will be late for dinner or absent during free time
- ✓ Accommodation care: Students are responsible for any potential damages caused at the accommodation



⚠ Any violation of Korean Law or Lexis Rules may result in students being sent home at their parents' expense before the completion of their course.
