Study Abroad with English Program (SAWE)

The Study Abroad with English program combines English language study with the chance to experience undergraduate classes in the United States for one or two semesters. This unique program allows undergraduate students to earn university credits in their field of interest without having to enroll in a long-semester degree program. Students enrolled will have access to all the support services available on campus and at Tilghman International Center, including exceptional one-on-one coaching, tutoring, social and cultural events, and more.

Visiting International Student Program (VISP)

Experience life on an American university campus while taking three to four of undergraduate credit-bearing classes per semester as a non-degree student for up to one year. Students enrolled will have access to all university facilities. The program can be customized for specific academic interests, with options in business, natural and social sciences, theatre arts, STEM, visual arts, and more.
